



## EE FINE ART

Continuing on from last month, November sees a solo exhibition featuring paintings by Romanian artist Roxana Donisanu. At just 23 years of age Roxana has already had many successful solo shows in Eastern Europe, her exhibited work being highly praised among critics and the media. Her oil paintings are full of beautifully blended pastel colours, with figures and objects merged into the simplified interiors or flattened landscapes. Strong shapes and form are accentuated by bold outlined strokes in each piece, reminiscent of work by 20th century masters such as Chagall or Picasso. This month also sees an exciting new group show by three eastern European

artists that investigates the theme of abstraction. Yuliy Takov is a young emerging artist whose paintings take on different viewpoints inspired by maps, with the shapes of continents emerging from built-up layers on the surface. Olgierd Pikiiewicz's paintings play with the balance between reality and abstraction by using strong colours and structures but almost always referencing something concrete. Tamás Kopasz focuses on the surface of the painting with the use of bold paint marks and brush strokes resulting in paintings expressing the mysterious and the chaotic.
